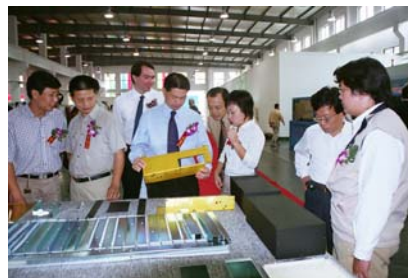


Located in one of the fastest growing industrial sectors in the world, Humanetics (Wuxi) is
